Why you should nominate

People involved in MoLeNET Phase 3 projects who have contributed to the successful introduction or further embedded mobile learning within their institutions. Award nominees may have improved their own practice, inspired and supported others, empowered their staff or learners, assisted culture change, developed sustainable infrastructure, innovative new approaches to learning or mobile apps.

Awards Ceremony

The prestigious Awards Ceremony will take place at the Queen Elizabeth II Conference Centre in the afternoon of the Mobile Learning Conference on Wednesday 29 September 2010. The awards will be hosted by Steve Nichols from the Skills Funding Agency and will be followed by a drinks reception.

The event will be a great opportunity to celebrate good practice, success and hard work within mobile learning in the education sector. Make sure you nominate and get involved.

What are the categories? Who can be nominated?

Senior Leadership Award

A principal, head teacher or other senior manager who has inspired and empowered their staff to successfully introduce mobile learning and enabled culture change within their institution.

Project Manager Award

A manager who has led and inspired others and championed mobile learning within their project or organisation.

MoLeNET Academy Leadership Award

A manager who has led and inspired others and championed mobile learning within a designated MoLeNET academy.

Researcher Award

A researcher who has carried out excellent and thorough institution based research and contributed to the overall process of developing the mobile learning evidence base.

Practitioner (Teacher) Award

Most creative, innovative and determined use of mobile technologies for teaching and learning.

Learner Award

Some learners have great ideas how to use mobile technologies for teaching and learning. This award will recognise a learner who has significantly contributed to or developed a learning idea or scenario which has been used by others.

Staff Development Award

Outstanding contribution to encouraging and supporting peers to undertake mobile learning.

MoLeSHARE / MoLeTV Award

Greatest contribution to sharing mobile learning resources/video and/or audio resources with the community (each resource should have a clear pedagogical value and explain a system, process or explain the use of a mobile device or relevant software).



Technical/Support Systems Award

Outstanding contribution to the development and support of a school / college / organisation infrastructure / VLE / intranet / network systems to support mobile learning and staff and/or students in the use of mobile learning.

Best Product Award

The hardware, software or service mobile learning product which has been the most useful / impressive / helpful / exciting / innovative / practical for learners and teachers.

Mobile Apps Development Award

The best mobile app developed by an education practitioner.

How are the winners decided?

All nominations will be judged by a panel of experts including members of the MoLeNET Advisory Board.
